




Webinar on “Intellectual Property Rights: What to know and what to do” on 12.11.2020

Harishchandrapur College organized a lecture about “Intellectual Property Rights: What to know and what to do” on 12.11.2020 in collaboration with IQAC. Ms. Sharmistha Basu, Assistant Professor, Department of Basic Science and Humanities of Narula Institute of Technology, was our invited speaker and delivered a wonderful, knowledgeable and enchanting speech on Intellectual Property Rights. The programme began from 8:30 PM. Dr. Arnab Chatterjee; Assistant Professor of English Department of Harishchandrapur College addressed and introduced our keynote speaker to the colleagues and students who were present in this programme.

Ms. Basu discussed that copyright/patent is a type of intellectual property that gives the creator of an original work, or another right holder, the exclusive and legally secured right to copy, distribute, adapt, display and perform a creative work usually for a limited time. She discussed that Intellectual Property Rights could be of two horizons: copyrights for processes and patents for products. It can be granted by public law and are in that case considered "territorial rights". This means that copyrights/patents granted by the law of a certain state that do not extend beyond the territory of that specific jurisdiction. Copyrights of this type vary by country; many countries, and sometimes a large group of countries, have made agreements with other countries on procedures applicable when works "cross" national borders or national rights are inconsistent. She gave us an informative speech on this topic. She also discussed that Copyright/patents protects two types of rights. Economic rights allow right owners to derive financial rewards from the use of their works by others. Moral rights allow authors and creators to take certain actions to preserve and protect their link with their work. The author or creator may be the owner of the economic rights or those rights may be transferred to one or more copyright/patent owners. The lecture ended with a vote of thanks. Participants were able to learn about the details of Intellectual Property Rights and its processes for different corners of learning.

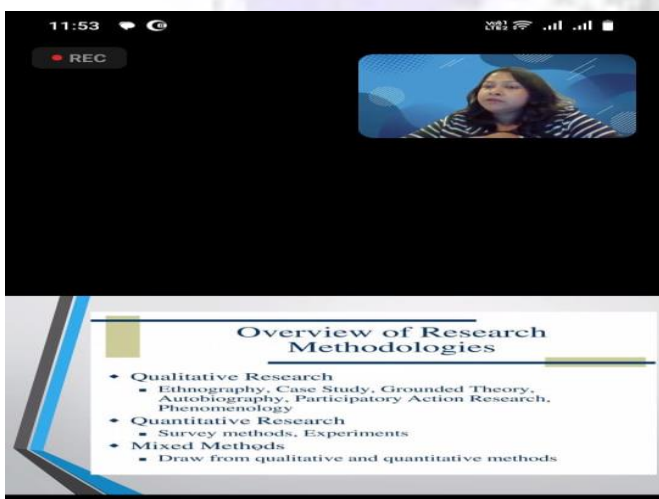
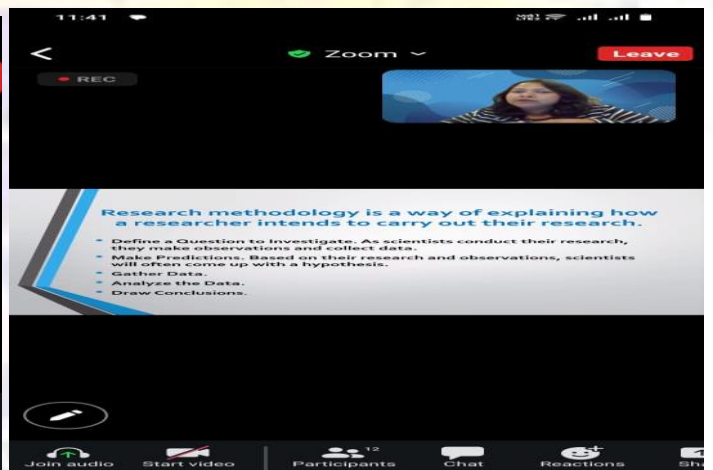
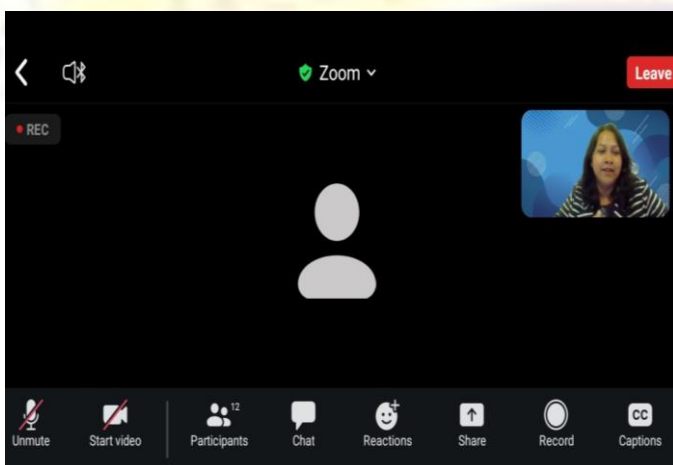
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Report of the webinar on “Research Methodology for New Researchers” on 08.12.2021

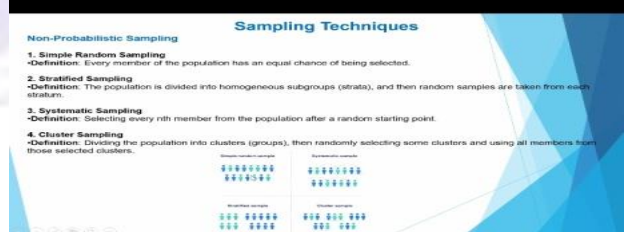
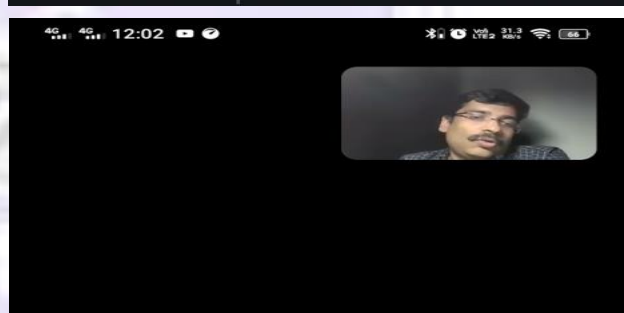
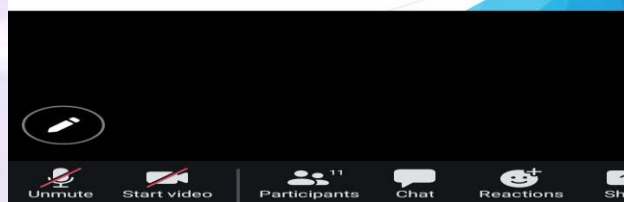
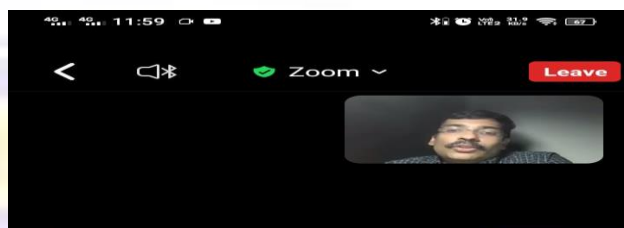
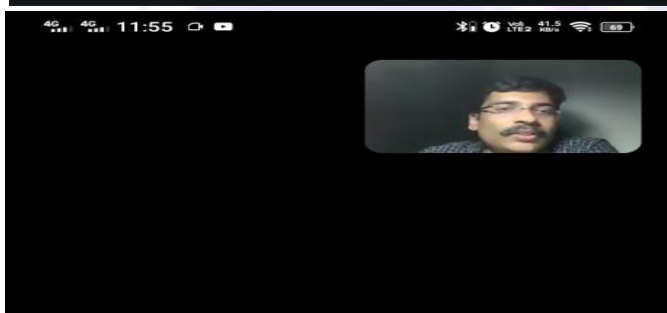
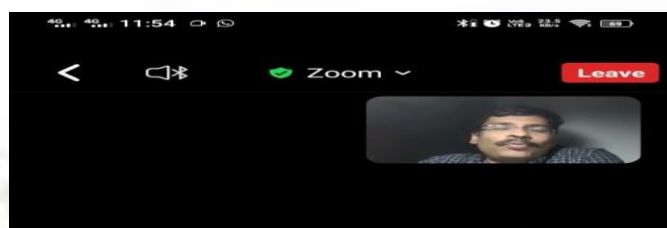

The programme began from 11:30 am. Dr. Biswas explained that research methodology is a way of explaining how a researcher intends to carry out their research. It's a logical, systematic plan to resolve a research problem. A methodology details a researcher's approach to the research to ensure reliable, valid results that address their aims and objectives. It encompasses what data they're going to collect and where from, as well as how it's being collected and analyzed. When designing a research methodology, a researcher has several decisions to make. One of the most important is which data methodology to use, qualitative, quantitative or a combination of the two. No matter the type of research, the data gathered will be as numbers or descriptions, and researchers can choose to focus on collecting words, numbers or both. She also discussed about the applications of research methodology in formulating hypotheses and testing of hypotheses in the domain of humanities. The lecture ended with a vote of thanks.




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Report of webinar on “Research Methodology: Processes and Validation”

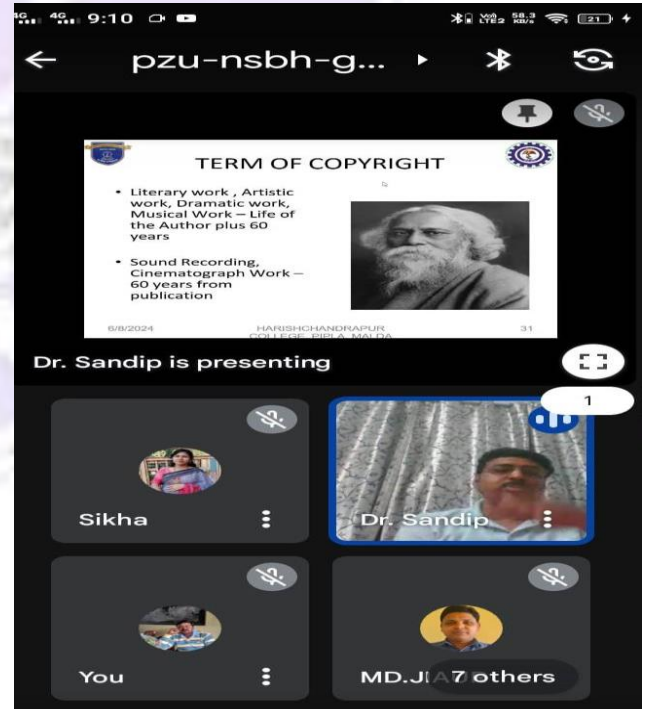
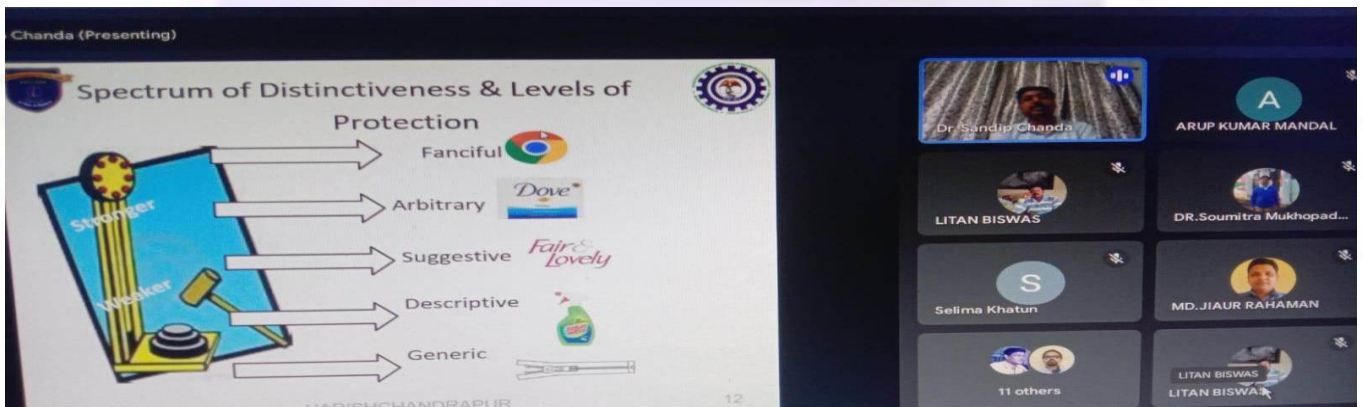
